Feedback is information about how we are doing in our efforts to reach our goal. Feedback is considered as one of the most powerful influences on any achievement as it enhances performance.

Students being the most important stakeholders in an educational institute, their feedback have become a widely used source of information to evaluate and improve teaching effectiveness. In order to provide good learning atmosphere, teachers have to be accountable for their performance. Feedback makes a teacher aware of students' pedagogical requirements and guides them to think what kind of facilitation is needed by their students.

Every year we gather feedback from students by asking them to complete an anonymous online survey about every teacher taking a course of study. Our form contains 10 questions – and we need quantitative response with '1.50' being unsatisfactory to '4'being very good.

The feedback received is then analyzed and a copy of the feedback is given to each faculty member. Those needing guidance are advised/counselled by the Vice Principal/Principal without disturbing the teacher's self esteem. Methods of improvements are discussed and recommended because a systematic measure of students' view cannot be ignored.
