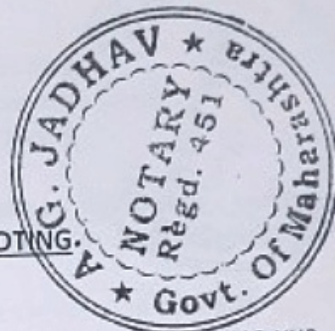

2. The First Party will use Classroom, Computer Lab and relevant infrastructure within the college premises for successfully conducting the courses from 12:00 PM to 05:00 PM (Monday to Friday).
3. In addition, on 1st Saturday of every month, the premises will be used to coordinate the educational field trip.
4. The First Party will place its Signboard and relevant Printed items for student mobilization as required by the compliance norms.
5. The First Party will be able to start the MES courses only after inspection, centre approval and subsequent batch approval.

TERM/DURATION of the AGREEMENT

1. The term of this agreement is for an initial period of 36 (Thirty Six) months commencing from 17th February, 2017.

TERMINATION OF AGREEMENT

1. Both parties shall have the right to terminate the Agreement with written notice.
2. The Second Party shall not request termination of Agreement before successfully completion of at least 4 (four) batches.
3. Agreement termination after 4 batches, will be effective only after successful completion of the current batch, including the formal assessment of the trainees by authorized Assessing body.
4. Termination without formal completion of the current batch will lead to inconvenience of the trainees, and both the parties agreed to allow the completion of the batch even after formal communication of termination of the agreement.

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATION

1. The First Party will not charge the Second Party any expense borne by the First Party to successfully conduct the course.
2. The Second Party will not charge the First Party for providing Classroom, Computer Lab and relevant tools & infrastructure.
3. However, the First Party shall pay the Second Party INR 15,000.00 (Fifteen Thousand only) from 3rd batch onwards.
4. The First Party shall pay from start date of 1st batch the monthly stipend - INR 4000.00 (Rupees ~~Three~~ ^{Four} Thousand only) to the College Peon as token of appreciation.

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A Report on The Industrial Visit to Silvassa for the academic year 2017-18

Impact Factor: To add to the practical knowledge of the students by showing them how work in an industry is carried out.

A.E.Kalsekar College of Commerce and Management had organised a One day industrial visit on 8th March 2018 located in Industrial Sector of Silvassa for the students of B.M.S and B.F.M.

The purpose of the visit was to give the students first hand practical knowledge, experience and technical knowledge of how industries function.

The students' first stop was **Alok Industry**, a manufacturer of clothing and home furnishings, where they observed how various operations are carried out using a variety of complex machinery. This industry produced clothing, 7 household furnishings, and other items. The

The information provided to pupils about the processes/techniques used in the manufacture of clothing was accurate. The students studied testing methods, the creation of a blanket based on research, embroidery work carried out by scanners and machines, manual method, etc.

The second stop was **Nipra Packaging**, which creates containers for bulk storage of paint and oil. The company developed pre-printed, ready-to-assemble sheets, which have since been its key competency. It produces barrels, mild steel barrels, plastic drums, and more. It produces plastic oil drums in sizes 10 litres, 20 litres, and 200 litres. This business also uses recycled plastic. Reliance supplies the raw materials like polythene.

Due to the fact that both industries were business to business, the students were better able to comprehend how these sectors operate.
